# **THE REDSKIN CHIEF**

**James R.  
"BUD"  
Jack**

**Athletic Director  
University of Utah**

When it comes to sheer love of athletics, few if any can top that of Utah's athletic director Bud Jack. The affable administrator has been at the helm of the Redskin athletic program for the past twelve years, during which time he has distinguished himself as one of the best in the business. He has gained the respect and admiration of all those associated with the Utah Camp, and his reputation for fairness and integrity during his tenure has put the University of Utah in high esteem in athletic circles.

Bud is a 1939 graduate of the University of Utah and served his alma mater as Business Manager and Assistant Athletic Director before moving to his present position. His ability is evidenced in part by the consistently challenging football schedule pitting the Redskins against the nation's finest football

teams. Under his leadership, the University of Utah Athletic Program has expanded and progressed rapidly. Bud has served as secretary for the Athletic Directors of the WAC since its formation in 1962, and on a national level, is a member of the Board of Directors for the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics. He was recently elected to his third term as a member of the United States Olympic Committee where he will serve as chairman for the NCAA Fund Raising Committee and Chairman of the prestigious Transportation Committee for the next four years.

An active member of his community, Bud serves on the Board of Directors of Rowland Hall and Saint Mark's Schools in Salt Lake City and is a past president of the Salt Lake Rotary Club.



## Head Coach

# BILL MEEK

Bill Meek began his career at Utah last season and immediately made a sweeping change in the football program. For years, the Redskins had been relying almost entirely on junior colleges to supply the manpower. Meek's philosophy turned in the direction of a strong freshman program and the University of Utah football program changed course and fielded the best freshman team in many years.

A 1943 graduate of Tennessee, where he excelled in both football and baseball, Meek played quarterback on championship Vol football teams in 1940 and 1942. He was an assistant at the University of Maryland from 1947 to 1950, when he accepted his first head coaching position at Kansas State University. During his four years at Kansas State, the Wildcats became a serious contender for the Big Eight championships. In 1955, he accepted the head job at the University of Houston and in his second year with the Cougars, won the Missouri Valley Conference Championship, a feat for which he was named "Missouri Valley Coach of the Year." The aggressive gridiron tactician was appointed head coach at Southern Methodist in 1957 and held the post until 1961 when he moved into

the Pro ranks. In every phase of his collegiate coaching career, Bill Meek took over teams undergoing a rebuilding program and produced some of the finest teams and individual players in the country, including Dallas Cowboy Quarterbacks Don Meredith and Jerry Rome, and Kansas City defensive standout, Jerry Mays, to mention only a few.

From 1961 to 1965, Bill Meek spent time as a Director of Player Personnel and offensive backfield coach for the Denver Broncos, and also with the Dallas Cowboys organization. The desire to return to the college ranks was fulfilled in 1966 when he accepted the position of offensive coordinator for the Cadets of Army. He spent two years at West Point directing the offensive unit for coach Tom Cahill and in those two seasons, the Cadets recorded two 8-2 seasons. His wide-open style of offense with a balance between running and passing not only made the game more effective in the won-loss column, but far more enjoyable to the spectator.

**DR. HARRY K. NEWBURN**  
Acting President, Arizona State

Dr. Harry K. Newburn, one of the nation's most capable and experienced educators, was appointed acting president of Arizona State University Aug. 23, 1969, following the resignation of Dr. G. Homer Durham, who had served as chief executive at ASU for nine years.

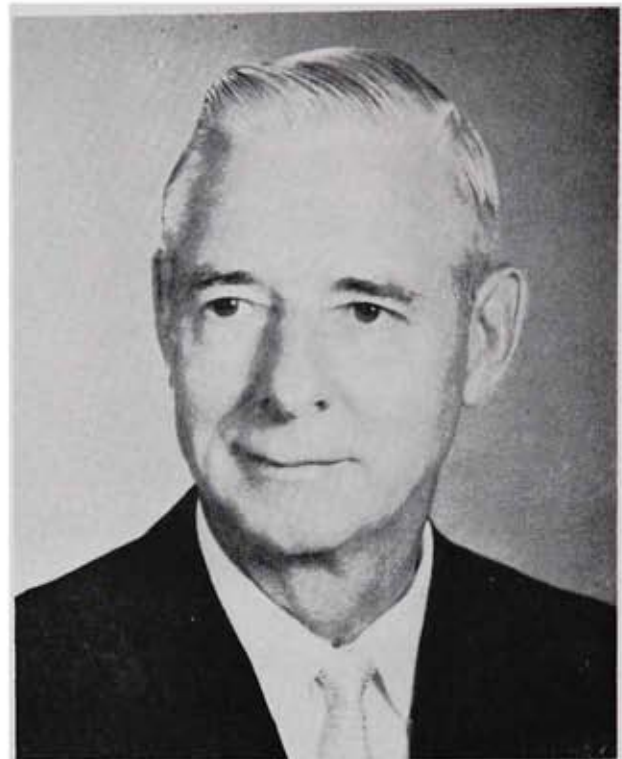
On leave as dean of the ASU College of Education, a post to which he was appointed on July 1, 1968, Dr. Newburn has previously served as president of the Universities of Oregon and Montana and as acting president and educational consultant to the Board of Trustees for the establishment of a new metropolitan university, Cleveland State University.

Dr. Newburn joined the ASU faculty in 1963 as professor of education and director of the University's Center for Higher Education, but shortly after his arrival in Tempe, he was granted a leave of absence to guide the formation of the new metropolitan university in Cleveland. Shortly after his return from Cleveland, he was designated dean of the ASU College of Education.

His studies of universities and their organization and administration have not been confined to the U.S. At one time he spent six months surveying the administration of universities in Great Britain, Italy and France on a Carnegie grant. He has also served as an educational consultant in Hawaii, Brazil and Venezuela.

The new ASU president was born in Cuba, Ill. He is married and is the father of three children. He received both his master's and his doctor of philosophy degrees from the University of Iowa.

He is a past-president of the Department of Higher Education, National Education Association.



**CLYDE B. SMITH**  
Athletic Director

Clyde B. Smith has served Arizona State University as Director of Intercollegiate Athletics and Chairman of the Department of Health, Physical Education and Recreation since 1955.

His ascendency to this present position was not by sudden flight but by serving a long apprenticeship in various athletic capacities before coming to ASU as head football coach in 1952.

Graduating from Monongahela High School, Pennsylvania, in 1929 he matriculated to Geneva College. He was a member of the Geneva College team that helped inaugurate the first Orange Bowl Game then held at Jacksonville, Fla.

Graduating from Geneva College and looking for an opportunity found him at Redstone High School at Republic, Pennsylvania, from 1929 to 1934.

In 1934 he was called to Indiana University to serve as head line coach for his former Geneva College Coach, Bo McMillin.

Looking for an opportunity to further broaden his background he became head football coach and instructor in Physical Education at State College, LaCrosse, Wisconsin, and later accepted the additional responsibilities of Athletic Director, Dean of Men, Director of Men's Housing, coach of basketball and baseball.

After serving in the U. S. Air Force in World War II he returned to LaCrosse to rebuild a program that had suffered during the period of emergency, as had all intercollegiate programs.

The year 1945 marked his return to Indiana University as head football coach. This all adds up to a considerable span of experience in years.

**FRANK KUSH**  
Head Football Coach

Frank Kush is in a rut. All he does is turn out winner after winner at Arizona State University.

Now the nation's fifth top active coach in win percentage, Kush never has experienced a losing season in 11 years as a head mentor — all at ASU. His record is 83 wins, 29 losses and one tie for a percentage of .741.

The recognition continues to roll in for Kush. He has been named to the West coaching staff for the 1969 Shrine Game in San Francisco, was wooed by other schools to take over their football programs and was treated to a special night by Sun Devil football fans last fall after compiling his second straight 8-2 season.

Kush has answered the challenge to the tune of a 46-17-1 mark against inter-sectional competition for a .730 percentage and a 37-12-0 conference mark (both the old Border and the WAC) for an amazing 75 percent victory skein.

It is ironic to note that there were many who considered Kush too young for the job when he took over at the age of 28.

To overcome adversity is typical of Frank Kush. He was born the son of a coal miner in Windber, Pa., and his only apparent future as a youth was to follow his dad into Mine No. 35.

But Kush set his sights high and never wavered.

Kush's winning formula is simple. He believes coaching involves something more than building a winning football team. He realizes that his teams are composed of individuals, and it is with these individuals that he is most concerned.

"All our efforts are aimed at making each individual athlete realize his full potential," Kush says. It takes a lot of sacrifice and discipline, but it will pay dividends not only now, but in later life."

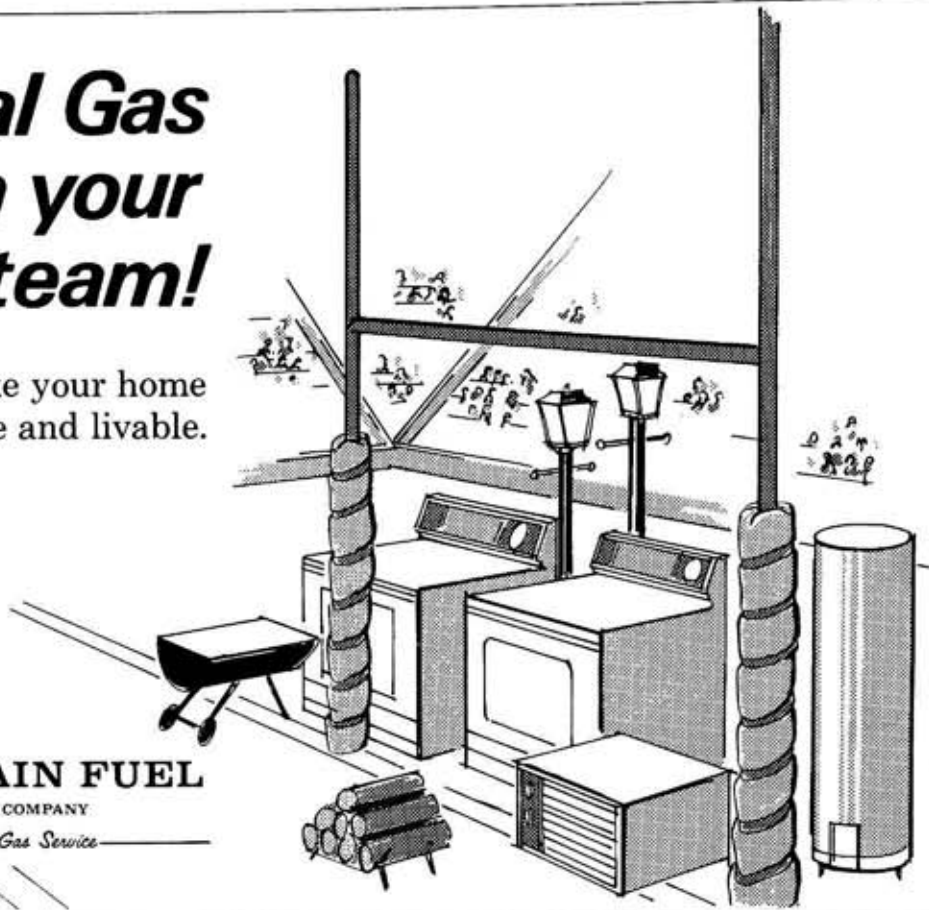

# The Sun Devil Campus

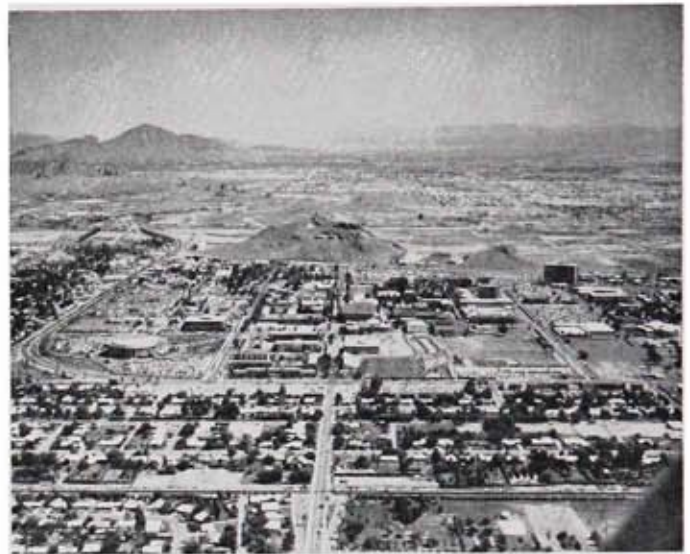
When the anticipated 24,550 Arizona State University students returned to the campus this fall, they found more than 250,000 square feet of new study, living and service facilities, 8,000 more seats in Sun Devil Stadium, and the comforts of refrigeration in a 75-year-old classroom building.

The students discovered construction activity at three major building sites which will add about 100,000 square feet to the campus by the end of the fall semester.

The timetable on the ASU construction calendar runs something like this:

A 15,650-square-foot addition to the Student Health Service and a 14,000-square-foot addition to the Home Economics building have been completed, and the University has converted the 59,338-square-foot Tempe Sands Motor Hotel into Mariposa Hall, a residence for graduate students.

The renovation, redecorating and the installation of refrigeration to Old Main, a classroom building erected in 1894, will be completed before the fall semester, and the Ira D. Payne Education Complex of two buildings, completed in July, adds 104,000 square feet to the 98,000 square feet which

have been serving the College of Education. The complex includes a classroom-laboratory building on Forest Avenue at the west end of the University Mall and a 500-seat lecture hall at the southwest corner of the Hiram Bradford Farmer education structure.

Also scheduled for a summer completion and occupancy in the fall semester was the Architecture portion of the block-long Art and Architecture Complex on Forest Avenue between 9th and 10th Streets. This complex is comprised of three buildings, totaling 141,885 square feet, of which the Architecture building constitutes 61,481 square feet. The Art building and a third structure, a lecture hall accommodating 500 students, should be ready for occupancy later in the semester.

The seating capacity of Sun Devil Stadium was expected to exceed 50,000 by Sept. 20 when the University of Minnesota opened the 1969 ASU football season, and by October, a 15,000-square-foot Lecture Hall should be completed just north of the Men's Gymnasium.

Scheduled for completion during the spring semester is the 100,000-square-foot addition to the Memorial Union.

# RUNNIN' REDSKIN BASKETBALL

Last season, facing the biggest rebuilding task in his years at Utah, Jack Gardner fashioned a remarkable 13-13 season and a surprising third place finish in the Western Athletic Conference.

Last year the Redskins were forced to build a team around only one of the top seven scorers from the year before; none of the top seven rebounders came back and outstanding guard Mervin Jackson was absent, to boot.

The 1969-70 team breakdown is bright; Utah should be stronger. And with the new 15,000 seat special events center waiting its inaugural, optimism pervades the Ute hoop camp.

"But the WAC, overall, will be an improved conference, as just about every team is up from last year," adds Gardner.

"With two perennial basketball powers, Colorado State and UTEP, entering the race this season, the WAC should be tougher than ever," said Gardner. "If I had to forecast the race now, I would say that UTEP and Arizona should be right on the top of the heap."

Despite the fact the Redskins will play what easily shapes up to be the toughest schedule in the school's history, Utah should fare pretty well with the material on hand.

Eight returning lettermen, including three sophomores and a junior who were all front liners, return from last season.

The sophomore triumvirate who represented the big question mark at the start of the 1968-69 season became the leading scorers and rebounders at its conclusion.

Guard Mike Newlin (21.2 ppg) a 6-4 LaCrescenta, Calif. native, was named WAC "Player of the Year" in his first campaign. He was a unanimous choice for All District Seven honors.

6-4 Forward Kenny Gardner gained the UPI all-conference honors and led the league in rebounding for all but the final two games of the season. Gardner finished with 16.1 and 10.1 scoring and rebounding averages.

Center Jim Mahler was the team's second leading rebounder and fourth leading scorer.

The other returning starter, 5-11 Bob Martin, makes up the second half of last year's brilliant backcourt combo.

Walt Hawkins, a 6-3 forward, shared starting duties last season with the graduated Joe English and looks like the tentative starter opposite Gardner at forward.

One of the most pressing problems Utah's coaches will face in the next few months deals with depth. If lettermen Ken Borrevik (6-6, F), Dennis Cook (6-10, C), and John Hunter (6-0, G), or squadman Terry Kunyz (6-8, C-F) contribute adequately, the Redskins could pose some problems for opponents.

But there are other sources for help.

Dan Cowan, a 6-4 guard, was a pleasant surprise for George Fisher's frosh last year with a 16.7 scoring norm, and will be in a dogfight for a starting call.

The only other frosh product will be 6-0 guard Rick Martin, a 7.7 scorer last year. Martin is a Granite high grad; Cowan attended South.

Four transfers — 6-5 Early Laster, 6-5 Ted Harper, 6-5 Ken Reynolds and 6-3 Bob Beam — may fit into the picture.

Laster and Harper are rugged enough to hold down the defensive end spots for the Green Bay Packers (Harper played football at Utah before transferring to Fullerton, Calif. JC). Laster comes from Kilgore (Texas) JC, Reynolds is former great at the College of Eastern Utah under Curt Jensen, and Beam played under another Jack Gardner pupil, Barney Newlee, at Chaffey (Calif.) JC.

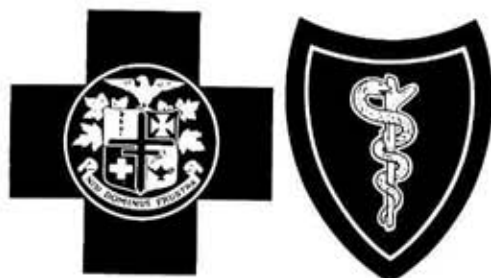

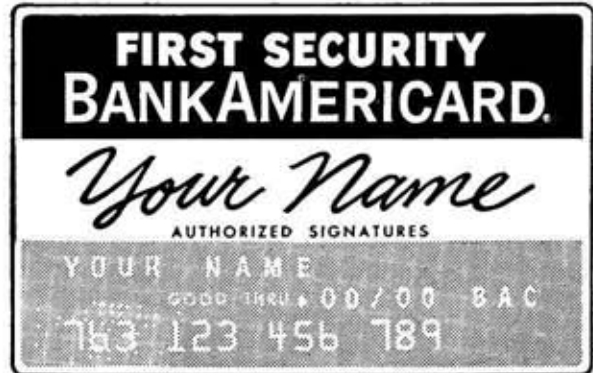

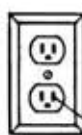

## RON TAYLOR

Head Freshman Coach

Ron Taylor played quarterback for the University of Missouri in 1959-60 and '61. He graduated in 1962 with a degree in English after leading Missouri to two conference championships. The aggressive signal caller played in two Orange Bowl Games (59-60) and in his senior year played in the Blue Gray Game. In 1960, his team entered the number three spot in national rankings by completing a 10-1 season. While at Missouri, he established a new record in pass percentage by completing an outstanding 62 percent for the entire season.

## JIM HANIFAN

Receivers

Jim Hanifan was an All American pass catcher for the 1954 Golden Bears at the University of California. He led the nation in pass receiving and total touchdown passes in his senior year. He played in the college All Star Game, the Hula Bowl and the East West Shrine game.

Jim's coaching career began after two years of military service in which his team won 24 consecutive games. His first assignment was at Yuba City College in California during 1959-60-61. He spent the following two years as head coach at Charter Oakes High School and in 1964 and 1965 was an assistant at Glendale Junior College.

## KEN VIERRA

Linebackers and Ends

Ken Vierra was a three-year letterman in football at the University of Utah where he was a top signal caller in 1957-58-59. Following his graduation in 1960, he accepted the head coaching position at Mount Eden High School in California. While there, his teams posted a 13-3 mark and in 1964 won the league championship. In 1965, he accepted an assistant coaching position at the University of California at Santa Barbara under his former head coach at Utah, Jack Curtice. The following year, he returned to his alma mater as an assistant to Mike Giddings where he coached the defensive backfield. Now beginning his fourth year at Utah, he will coach the linebackers and ends.

## DICK SCESNIAK

Offensive Line

Dick Scesniak established himself as one of the outstanding linemen in the Big Eight Conference during 1960-61-62. He was a guard for the Cyclones of Iowa State University, and following his graduation in 1963 with a degree in Business, Dick enrolled in Law School at the University of Missouri and became an assistant coach to Dan Devine. In 1965, he accepted a similar position at his alma mater, Iowa State, where he was in charge of the offensive line for three seasons.

## JIM LARUE

Defensive Coordinator

Jim LaRue joined the Redskin staff last year as defensive coordinator and added a wealth of experience and ability to the Redskin football program. A graduate of Duke University and the University of Maryland, LaRue distinguished himself as a top-notch athlete.

Jim entered graduate school at the University of Maryland in 1947 and first came in contact with Bill Meek, who was then an assistant. LaRue played for Maryland in 1947-48-49 and the following year accepted the position of freshman coach. In 1951, Jim went to Kansas State as an assistant to Bill Meek.

## GENE EPLEY

Defensive Line

Gene Epley comes to the Utah coaching staff after spending 2 years as offensive line coach at Utah State where Aggie teams posted a 2 year record of 15-4-1.

Epley played offensive tackle at Indiana State University of Pennsylvania. After graduation in 1965, he played one year for the Richmond Rebels in the Continental Football League. Epley then became line coach at Sewickley Area High School in Pennsylvania where his teams posted an 18-2 record over two years and won the Western Pennsylvania Championship both years. He then moved to Utah State where he received his masters degree in Physical Education in addition to his coaching responsibilities. At Utah, Epley will work with the defensive line.

# A Big Day for Windber, Pa.

The current population of Windber, Pa. runs in the area of about 9,000.

And to 8,998 of that number, this afternoon's confrontation between two fine Western Athletic Conference teams means very little.

But as coincidence has it, two important actors in this afternoon's football drama — Frank Kush and Billy Hunter — are Windber, Pennsylvanians.

Kush, of course, is the ultra-successful head coach of the Arizona State University Sun Devils, and Billy Hunter is the ultra-successful running back for the University of Utah Redskins.

In Kush's youth the biggest economic factor in the tiny Pennsylvania town was coal mining. And Frank's only apparent future as a youngster was to follow his dad to Mine No. 35.

But Kush, one of 15 kids, set his sights high and turned his energy to football.

Although he worked both before and after school in a garage to help support the family (his father died when he was 14), Kush found time to play on the Windber High School football team and earned All-Pennsylvania honors. He was three times president of his high school class.

The diminutive (170 pounds) guard battled his way to a starting berth under "Biggie" Munn at Michigan State and played in only one losing game in his entire collegiate career.

After earning several All-America accolades and serving a two-year stint in the Army, Kush became Dan Devin's assistant at Arizona State.

Devin moved to Missouri early in 1958 and Frank Kush — at the ripe old age of 28 — assumed the head coaching responsibilities in Tempe.

Since that time his record (83-29-1) has done all the talking for him. That record, which includes wins this season over Brigham Young and Minnesota, ranks Kush fifth in win percentage among active college coaches.

The formula which has molded the Frank Kush success story is, if for no other reason than a geographical one, similar to the slowly unfolding one on speedy Billy Hunter.

Neither individual is big by modern football standards, both were highly sought after by some top schools and both, in the course of their collegiate academic-athletic careers, made switches of schools.

After a semester at Washington and Lee University, Kush transferred to Michigan State where he had such great success. Hunter spent all of his freshman and part of his sophomore years at the U.S. Military Academy in West Point, N.Y.

In fact, Billy was named ECAC (East Coast Athletic Conference) back of the week in the first game of his collegiate career last year against the Citadel. In that game, Billy ran the opening kickoff back 90 yards for a touchdown. That was the first time he had ever handled the ball.

"Billy played in every game but the one against Navy, which was a real disappointment for him," said his mother, Mrs. William Hunter.

After making his decision to change schools, Billy was contacted by South Carolina, Tennessee, Syracuse and Clemson, among others. But his acquaintance with former Utah assistant Tom Modrak (who once coached the Army plebes) influenced Billy to enter Utah.

So, barring the advent of a tie, the Windber influence should make somebody's fans pretty happy before the afternoon is completed.

# MEET THE REDSKIN CAPTAINS



## RAY GROTH — Quarterback

5' 11" - 180 - 22 - Senior - Idaho Falls, Idaho

Ray Groth will be playing his final year of collegiate football in 1969. A two year starter, the speedy signal caller from Idaho Falls, Idaho is one of the most versatile performers in the Western Athletic Conference. As a sophomore, he played flanker and proved to be one of the best pass receivers on the squad. He had 18 receptions for 299 yards and three touchdowns. Last season as a junior, he was moved to the signal calling position where he had gained recognition as a high school All American. At quarterback, he accounted for more than half of the Redskins total offensive output and was named to the U.P.I. All Western Athletic Conference Team. One of the most exciting players to ever don a Redskin uniform, he is a definite candidate for All American in 1969.

## LARRY STONE — Linebacker

5' 11" - 205 - 21 - Senior - Anaheim, California

Pound for pound, defensive captain Larry Stone could very well be the best linebacker in the Western Athletic Conference. He will begin the 1969 season where he started two years ago, and during those two years, he has been one of the most consistent players to dot the starting lineup. He has good mobility, outstanding speed and loves the feel of contact. For the past two years, he has started every game and has been charged with calling the defensive signals. As a prep player at Anaheim High School in California, he was named to the All League, All District and All State Teams. A definite candidate for post season honors in his final year.



# Two Utes Make All-Time Team

Fifteen of the 20 players selected last summer to the all-time Rocky Mountains-Southwest region football team came from Western Athletic Conference member institutions.

Every member had at least one former great on the first team.

The team, selected by a panel of four sports editors who represented 131 years of covering college football, invoked many arguments among football fans throughout the region. But unanimity was impossible in covering this controversial subject.

So strong was the first team that former greats such as All-Americans, end Dewey McConnell, and halfback Jim Crawford of Wyoming; Fred Enke, Arizona quarterback; and Wilford "Whizzer" White, Arizona State back; were delegated to the second team or honorable mention status.

It was a young team, too. Seven of the twenty-first team members played during the 1960s.

Youngest of all was linebacker Ron Pritchard, a consensus All-American at Arizona State last year. Pritchard won the Outstanding Player Award in the East-West Shrine Game last fall, then captained the victorious West team in the Coaches All-American game in June.

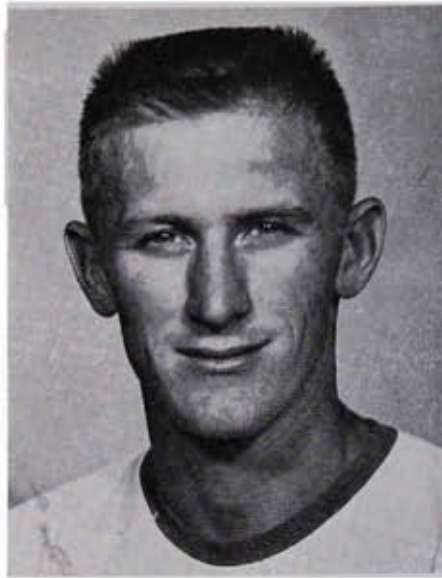
The WAC scored a clean sweep at end, guard and linebacker, and had at least one player at every other position on the team.

Both Utah first team winners were backs, **Frank Christensen**, enshrined in the Helms Hall of Fame, played fullback on Utah teams in 1930-32 which never lost a conference game. **Larry Wilson**, now a defensive back with the St. Louis Cardinals, once scored five touchdowns in one game against Arizona.

Arizona State was presented by Pritchard and middle guard Curley Culp, a behemoth whose upper body strength was legendary.

Brigham Young placed ace end Phil Odle on the first team. Odle owns WAC career (183) and season (77) pass receiving marks. He was honored with a "Phil Odle Day" by BYU in 1967.

Colorado State had three members of the first team, more than any other school. The Rams placed tackle Thurman "Fum" McGraw, guard Dale Dorrill and defensive back Jack Christiansen on the first team. All three went on to pro fame. McGraw, an all-round athlete

who was Skyline Conference heavy-weight wrestling champ and a strong shot putter and discus thrower in track, now is assistant athletic director at Colorado State.

A couple of old timers represented Arizona. They were end Hank Stanton and center Tom Greenfield. Stanton set a national pass receiving record by snagging 50 aerials in 1941. Greenfield was a standout center in 1936-38 who went on to star with the Green Bay Packers.

Don Perkins earned a glamorous first team offensive backfield post for New Mexico. He is one of just two Lobo players ever to have his jersey number retired. After college he played with the pro Dallas Cowboys and is one of the top five all-time pro rushing leaders.

Although Texas-El Paso football now is synonymous with a potent offense, both of the Miner first teamers played defensive linebacker. Fred Carr, the 1967 All-American built like an Oak tree at 6-5 and 230 pounds, and Wayne Hansen, a big, strong blond who played for Jack Curtice in 1947-49, were worthy winners.

Wyoming placed defensive back Chuck Lamson and kicker Jerry DePoyster on the first team. Lamson quarterbacked Wyoming to 8-2 and 6-1-2 seasons in 1960 and 1961. DePoyster kicked three game-winning field goals while leading the Cowboys to the Sugar Bowl in 1967 and has scored more points (182) by kick-scoring than any player in college football history.

Other members of the first team were tackle Merlin Olsen and center Elmer Henry "Bear" Ward of Utah State, offensive backs Byron "Whizzer" White of Colorado and Earl "Dutch" Clark of Colorado College, and defensive back "Wild Bill" Kelly of Montana.

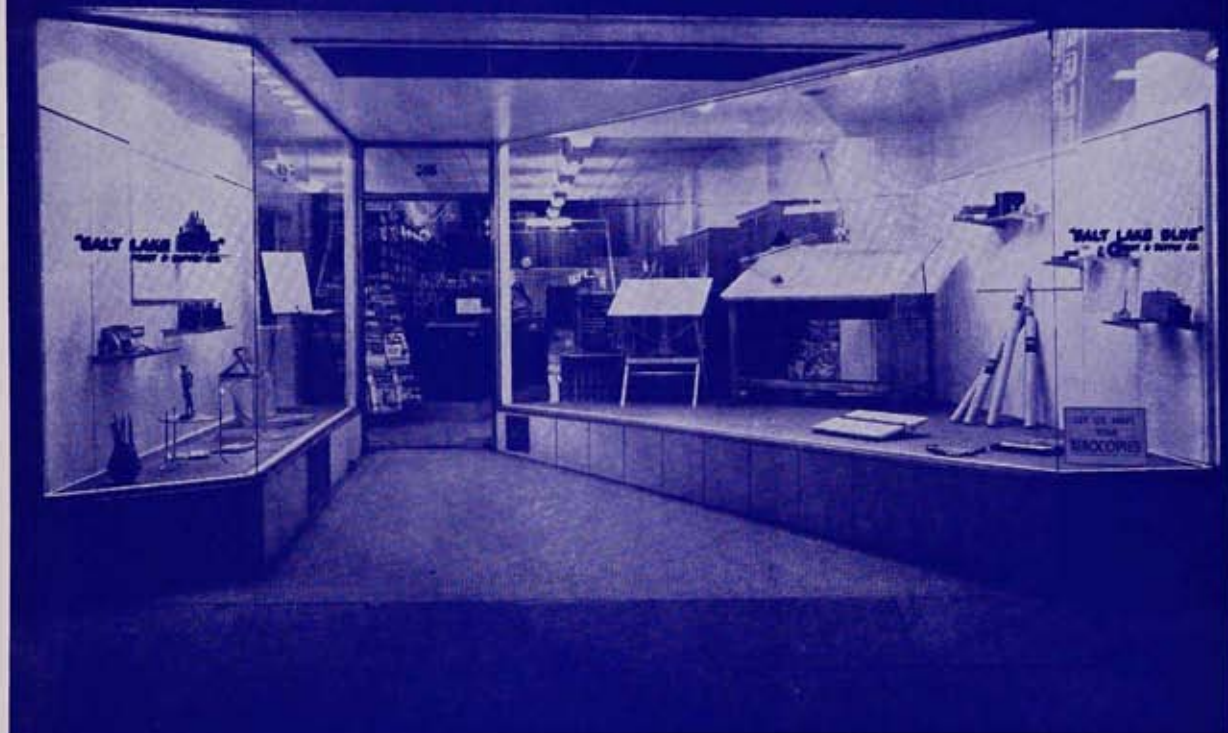
