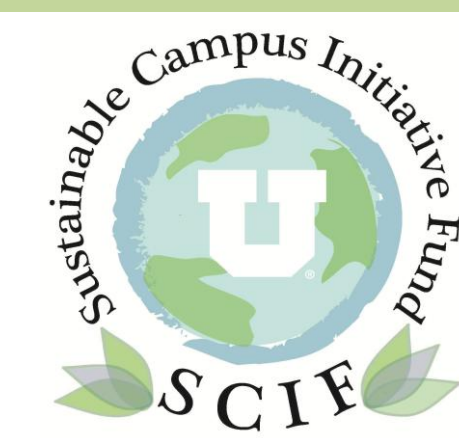


# Green Team Sponsored SCIF Projects

## University of Utah



### SCIF

The Sustainable Campus Initiative Fund (SCIF) provides an opportunity for Green Teams to collaborate with students to complete green projects in their departments. This poster includes a brief description of completed and recently approved SCIF funded projects, which resulted from Green Team and student partnerships.

### Marriott Library Green Team



#### Project: Water Bottle Filling Stations (Spring 2011)

Installation of water bottle filling stations and an education campaign, Just Fill It!, on the environmental impact of water bottles. The goal of this project was to reduce the number of plastic water bottles consumed at the library and to encourage library patrons and employees to use refillable water bottles.

#### Project: The Paper Project (Spring 2012)

The goal of this project was to reduce paper consumption in the library and switch to 30% post consumer recycled content paper.

#### Project: Water Bottle Filling Station (Approved Spring 2012)

Installation of a water bottle filling station in the Annex Building to encourage students and staff to bring their own water bottles to refill.



### Social Work Green Team



#### Project: Bike to the U Day (Fall 2011)

A campus wide event that promoted an increase of bicycle commuters to the University of Utah as well as showcased bicycle initiatives on campus such as the Fix-It Yourself Bike Racks and the student-led Bike Collective.

#### Project: Social Soup (Fall 2011)

A discussion series focused on food issues. The goal of these events is to increase education and discussion of food to encourage healthier, more sustainable food purchases.

#### Project: Lights Out (Spring 2010)

A research project focused on how to actively engage students in turning off lights in empty classrooms.

#### Project: Water Bottle Filling Station (Approved Spring 2012)

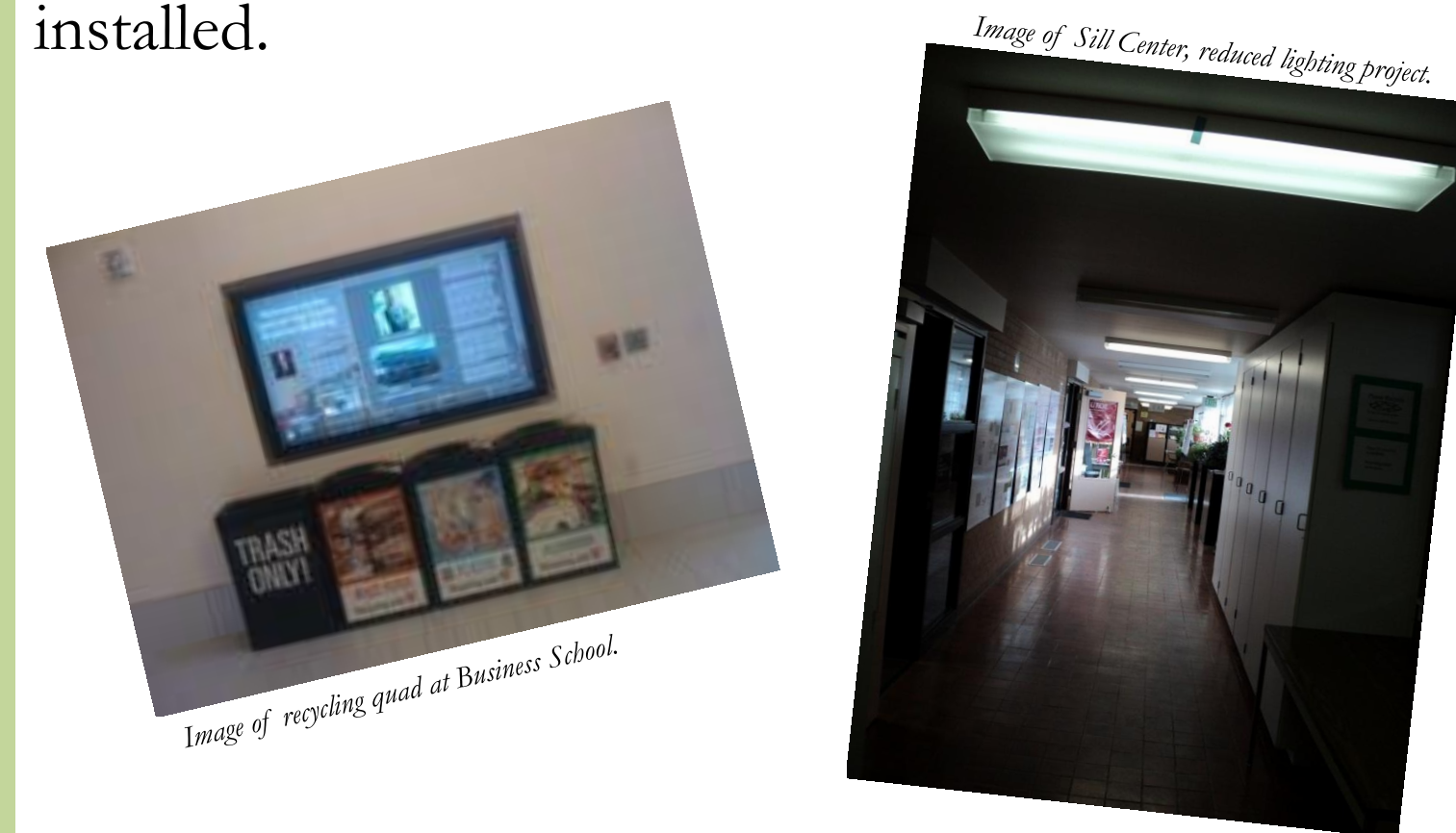
Installation of a water bottle filling station in the School of Social Work to reduce waste and encourage students to bring their own water bottles to refill.



### Sill Center Green Team

#### Project: Power Down (Spring 2010)

A project to reduce the Sill Center's electrical power needs, while making the users of the building more aware of their energy consumption. Ambient light sensors, motion sensors, and light switches were installed.



### David Eccles School of Business

#### Project: Business of Recycling (Spring 2012)

Provided recycling bins for every floor of the three business school buildings and completed an awareness campaign to encourage recycling and waste diversion from landfills.

### Orthopaedic Center

#### Project: Orthopaedic Center Parking Lighting Retrofit (Approved Spring 2012)

Funding to remove the current 150 watt metal halide lighting and replace with energy efficient, cost saving lighting. The project has been confirmed to save energy and cut costs by a minimum \$2500/year. The plan is to use the money saved to fund future green projects for the building.



### Humanities Green Team

#### Project: LNCO Lighting Efficiency (Approved Spring 2012)

Reduce the inefficient and wasteful electricity used in the Humanities LNCO building by installing sensors to control lighting arrays in restrooms and hallways.
